LEARNING AND SERVING

If you are reading this, you are probably one of the 88% of the world's population lucky enough to have attended primary school. Possibly, you have also been to secondary school (60%), and you may even be one of the 27% who have studied beyond secondary school level. *

In our culture, access to education is often taken for granted and education is increasingly seen as a commodity to be bought and sold for individual gain. This was not Jesus' view of education. Jesus used parables and stories as an accessible way to help people see the world through God's eyes and challenge them to act for justice.



In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 9:16-17) he speaks of being entrusted with a commission – a commission to proclaim the gospel by making ourselves 'a slave to all', living alongside the poor and the weak, and serving others.

As Christians we are called to work for a fairer world – to ensure that everyone has access to education, that our schools include those on the margins of society, and to tackle the root causes of poverty and inequality that lead to millions of people around the world being denied their basic human rights.

Last year's student protests and the debate around Higher Education funding highlight a fundamental question – what is education for? Our time in education is not simply about preparing us for the workplace; it is also about the development of the whole person and finding ways to use our newly acquired skills and knowledge in the service of others.

In Mark's Gospel we read the story of Jesus healing the woman with a fever. He 'took her by the hand and lifted her up'. How can we lift others up? Serving others can be as simple as making a cup of tea and really listening to someone's story, or volunteering in our local community, getting to know our neighbours and listening to those on the margins.

We can also use our skills and talents in the service of education. For some people this might be as teachers, youth workers, classroom assistants, chaplains, careers advisors, counsellors and support workers, but all of us can do something to support young people and students in our communities and churches.

Through the service of others we can proclaim the gospel of justice, peace and love for all. Education is a means of becoming more effective partners with God, enabling us to share in God's work of redemption.

About Education Sunday

Education Sunday is a national day of prayer and celebration for everyone involved in the world of education. For more than 100 years there has been an annual recognition of Education Sunday in England and Wales (traditionally on the ninth Sunday before Easter).

The resources are designed to help you prepare for your own celebration on or around Education Sunday, or on any other day during the year, such as the start or end of the academic year. You can use these resources in your church, in local schools, colleges and universities and in other places of learning.

Next year Education Sunday will be on 27 January, 2013.
